Motivation Letter (max. 500 words) 2. CV (incl. contact information and photo) 3. Portfolio of artistic work in PDF format (for Visual Arts Dpt.) OR Writing sample in English (e.g. essay or thesis) for Art Theory and History Dpt. 4. Official attestation of English knowledge on B2 level <p>Important: Nomination does not mean acceptance. There is a selection and approval procedure. Applications can be declined due to insufficient portfolio and/or prerequisites.</p>

EXTRAS	<p>Library: Students can borrow books, provided that they return them in due time before their departure.</p> <p>Catering: ASFA holds a restaurant in its premises in Peiraios street, where Erasmus students can have breakfast, lunch and dinner at a reduced price (currently 2,50€ per day for any or all three meals). Free catering might be offered, depending on School Funds each AY.</p> <p>Academic ID card: offers reduction in public transport and entrances to museums. The registration/application is made online and relevant instructions are sent to the students from the Erasmus office by email.</p> <p>Annexes: ASFA runs seven "Annexes". These are artistic stations in different parts of Greece, which are used by the School as special educational centers. Incoming students are welcome to use an Annex in order to prepare or complete an artistic project. To book a stay in any of the Annexes, Erasmus students should ask for their supervising professor's permit and submit an application form to the relevant Department.
